Junior Course Selection Recap

- Course Requests: all changes must be submitted by MAY 8.
- Students will receive a paper copy of their requests with important notes. Please ask your student to share their requests with you because these requests are what will be used to create their junior year schedule. Once schedules are finalized, there will be minimal movement/changes.
- Students are required to take the following classes junior year:
 - English 3
 - Math
 - U.S. History
 - PE
 - Elective
 - A 3rd year of science is highly encouraged to keep postsecondary options open.
 - Elective
 - Students may want to consider Consumer Education: Adult Living or Personal Finance. (semester-only class; some students have already completed this requirement)

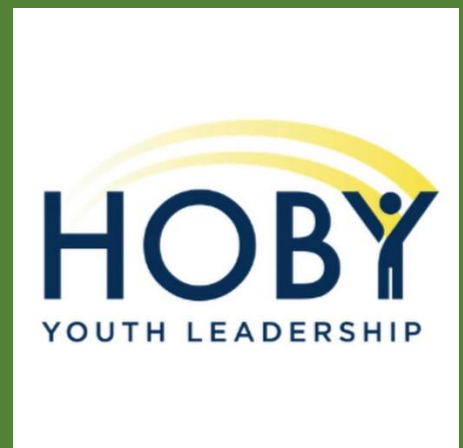


SIH Summer Internship Program

CCHS Requirements to Attend SIU Day

- (1) Student must be a sophomore and have a 2.75 GPA or higher.
- (2) You must be passing all your classes to attend; grades will be checked on April 20.

Each action step below must be completed in order to attend:

1. By March 18: student must complete a brief survey in Naviance to show interest in attending the event. This survey can be found in the "Important Tasks and To-Do" section of Naviance titled *SIUC Day Registration*. You will be asked three questions---
 1. What is your GPA? *This can be found in your Student Portal under Academic History.*
 2. Why would you like to attend SIU Day?
 3. Are you interested in applying to SIU in the future?
2. March 23-27: I will meet with students to complete the SIU registration form (please do not do this online until we meet). You will need to know your t-shirt size and which session(s) you want to attend, please review the list (link provided below).
3. April 16: field trip permission forms are due; students will be given a field trip permission form at their meeting with Mrs. Krutsinger. Parent/guardian must sign this form.
