



WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DUAL ENROLLMENT & DUAL CREDIT COURSES?

- Dual Credit-- Taught by a CCHS teacher
- Dual Enrollment-- Taught on the JALC campus or online
 - Students receive JALC college credit for BOTH dual credit and dual enrollment courses. CCHS students do not receive high school credit for dual enrollment courses

TAKE THE ACCUPLACER TEST

- Any student taking a dual credit or dual enrollment class next year must take the ACCUPLACER to be eligible for these classes.
- **The test will be offered in the CCHS Library on April 21st.**
 - Bring your chromebook and a pencil
- If you are unable to test on April 21st, you will need to schedule a time to take it at JALC in order to take the dual credit and/or dual enrollment classes in summer/fall
- Info and an admissions ticket will be mailed home
